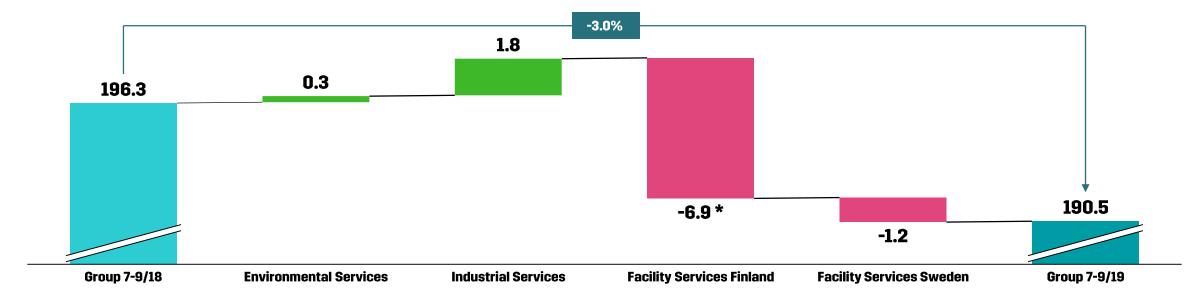
HIGHLIGHTS

- Lassila & Tikanoja's business developed positively in January-September excluding Facility Services Finland. Operating profit increased year-on-year in Environmental Services, Industrial Services and Facility Services Sweden.
- In Facility Services Finland, operating profit was weighed down by costs related to the implementation of a new operating model in technical services business. Cleaning business developed favourably due to new customer accounts in the third quarter.
- In Environmental Services, strong demand in retail and industrial segments as well as in renewable energy sources compensated for the impact of municipalisation on net sales.
- During the remainder of the year, we will focus on establishing the new operating model in Facility Services Finland and improving the division's profitability.

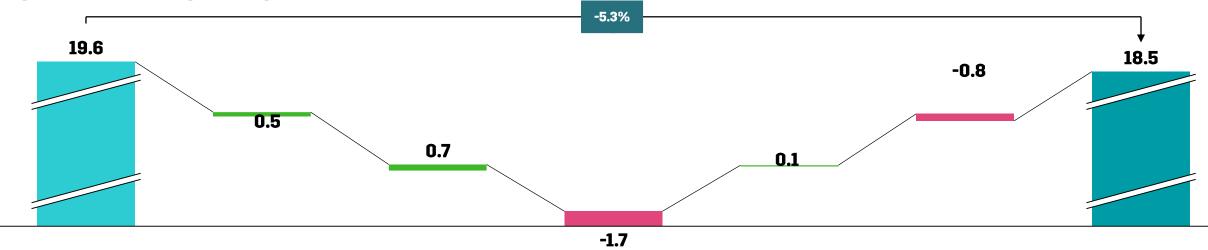

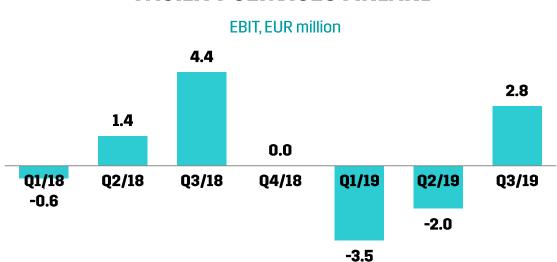

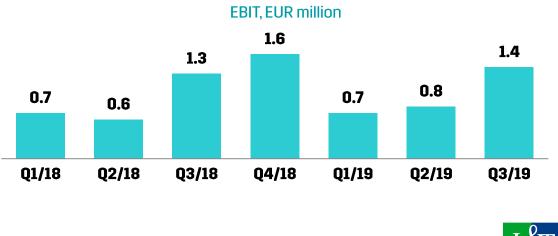

ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES

- Measures taken to improve the efficiency of production had a positive impact on operating profit.
 Demand for new circular economy services and renewable energy sources was at a good level in the third quarter.
- Strong demand in the retail and industrial segments as well as renewable energy sources compensated for the impact of municipalisation on net sales. Operating profit increased due to the improved efficiency of operations in January-September.

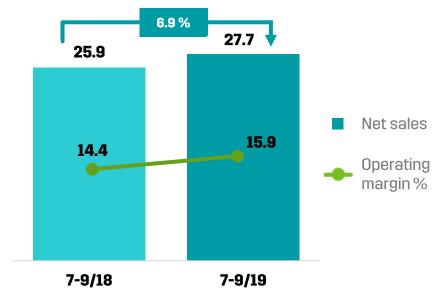




INDUSTRIAL SERVICES

- Demand was at a good level and the third quarter was strong particularly with respect to industrial sites and the project business.
- The slowing down of the construction sector was compensated by new customer accounts in industrial sites and the project business in January-September.

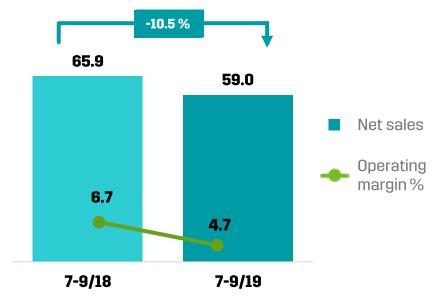




FACILITY SERVICES FINLAND

- In the third quarter, the operating profit declined year-on-year due to the smaller contract portfolio in property maintenance and the costs related to the implementation of a new operating model in technical services. The cleaning business developed favourably thanks to new customer accounts.
- The operating profit being substantially lower in January-September was mainly due to costs related to the implementation of the new operating model in technical services and the contract portfolio of property maintenance being lower than in the comparison period.

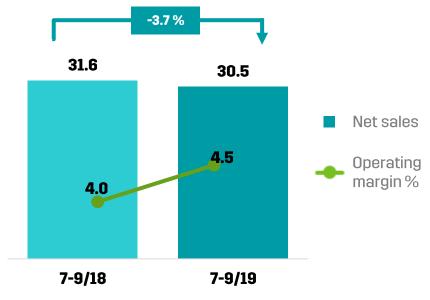




Q3 2019 FACILITY SERVICES SWEDEN

- The demand for technical services remained strong in the municipal and hospital sectors as well as in the commercial segment, but the competition has become more intense. The measures taken to improve the efficiency of production had a positive impact on operating profit in the third quarter.
- The demand for technical services increased in Sweden, but sales growth was slowed by problems related to the availability of labour. The profitability of cleaning business improved towards the end of the period.

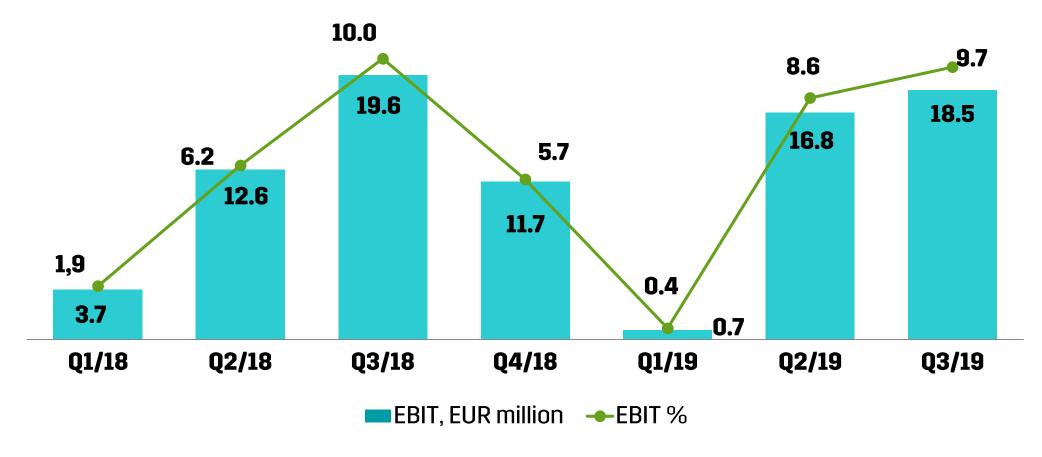

The sale of L&T Korjausrakentaminen Oy had an EUR 5.1 million impact on the Group's operating profit in January-September.

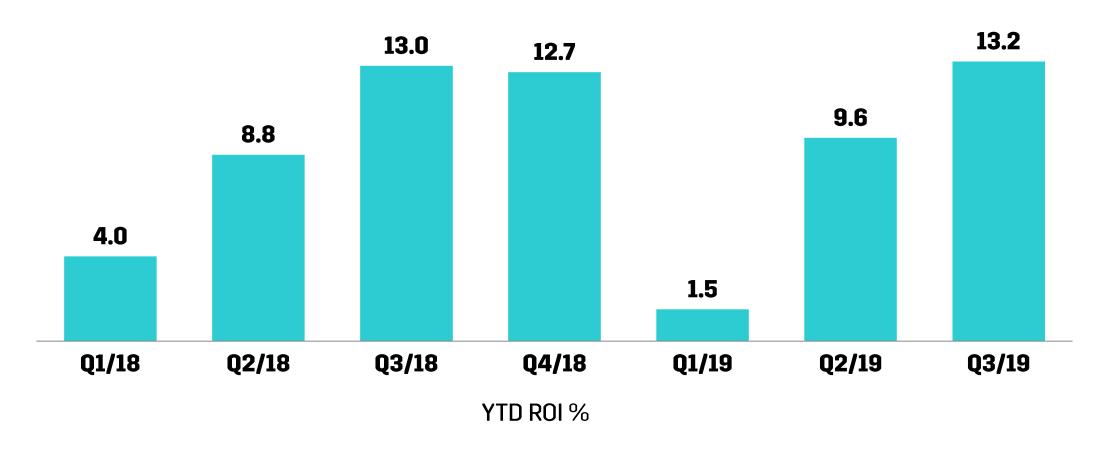




Q3 2019 RETURN ON INVESTMENT



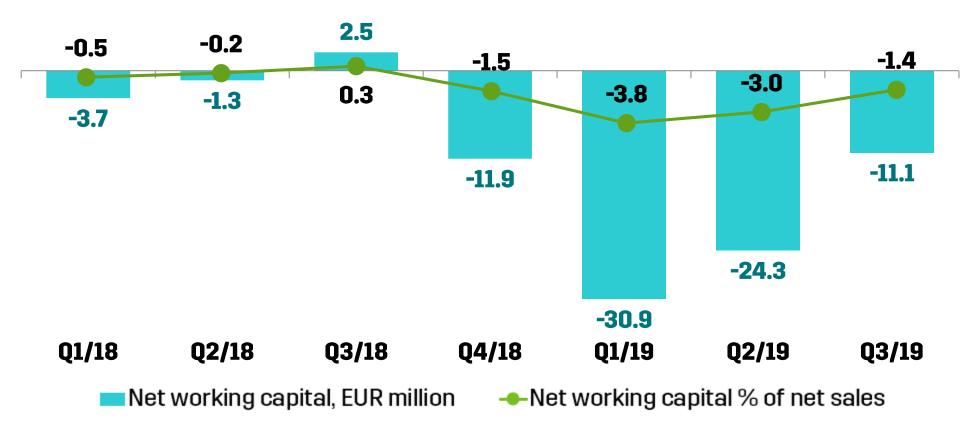

Q3 2019 NET WORKING CAPITAL

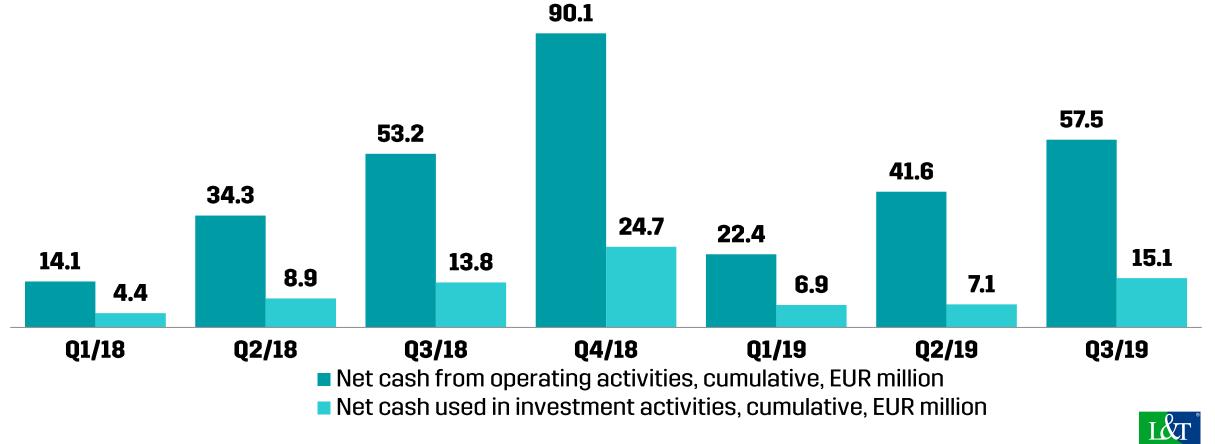
Measures for improving the efficiency of working capital management were started in the beginning of year 2018.





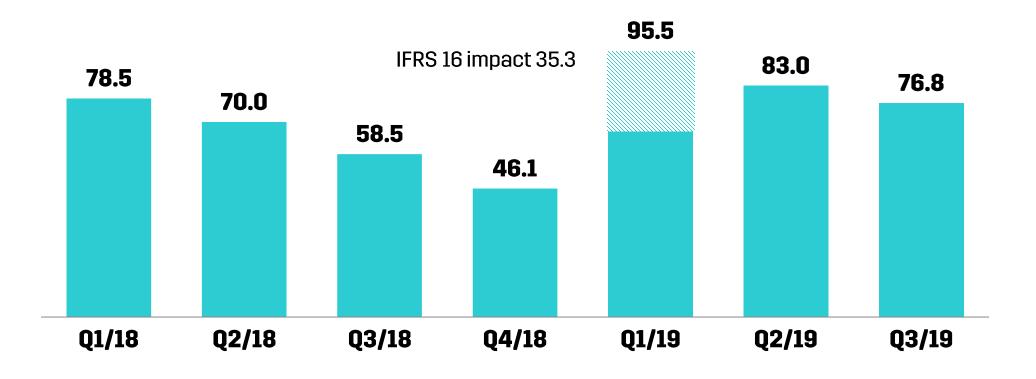


Net cash flow from operating activities has improved year-on-year. IFRS 16 had EUR 9.1 million positive impact to operative cash flow in January - September.





Gearing % increased from the comparison period mainly due to IFRS 16.

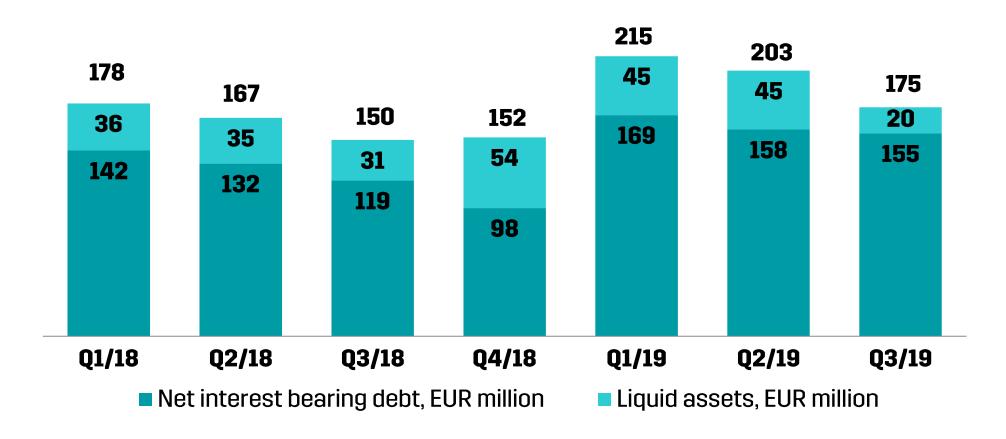


Gearing, %



INTEREST BEARING DEBT

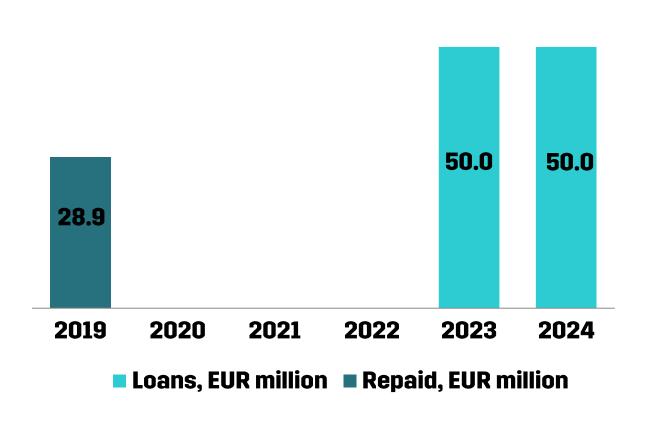
Net interest-bearing debt increased mainly due to IFRS 16 adoption. The change increased balance sheet debt by EUR 53.8 million from 1 January 2019.

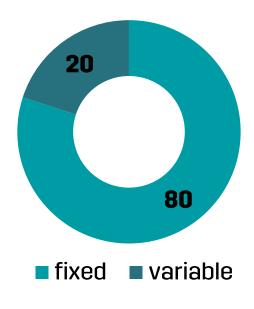




Q3 2019 MATURITY STRUCTURE OF LOANS

OUTLOOK FOR THE YEAR 2019

Lassila & Tikanoja's full-year net sales in 2019 are estimated to be on par with 2018 and operating profit is estimated to be below 2018 level. The outlook does not take into account the impact of the divestment of L&T Korjausrakentaminen Oy.

OPERATING ENVIRONMENT

RELEVANT MARKET TOTALS EUR 6.2 BILLION AND IS GROWING AT 2.6% ANNUALLY



- The market is large and offers room for growth especially now as the Finnish GDP is growing fast
- The EUR 6.2 billion relevant market in Finland is expected to grow at a compound annual rate of ~2.6%² during the years 2017 – 2020
- Focus on strengthening market positions in the business segments
- A healthy balance sheet enables investments and business acquisitions, as also indicated by the recent Veolia FM AB acquisition in Sweden
- The relevant market size in Sweden is estimated at EUR 5.5 billion, mainly consisting of property cleaning, maintenance and technical services
 - The relevant Swedish market is expected to grow at ca. 3% annually

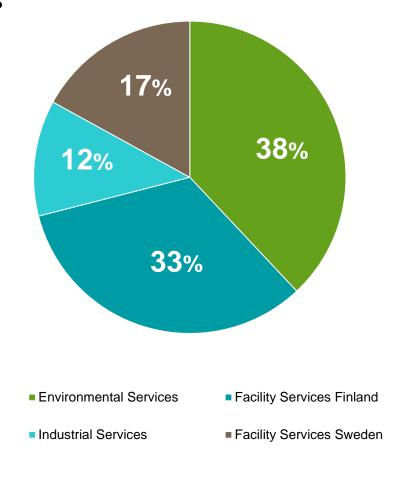

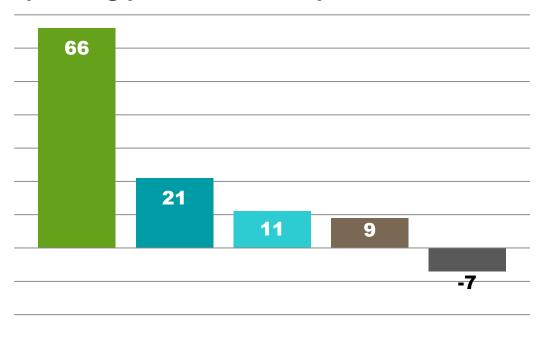

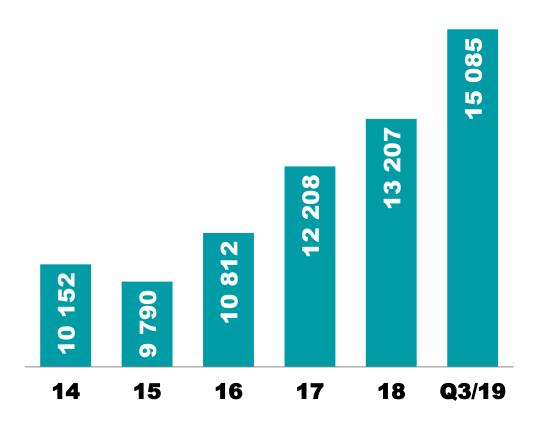

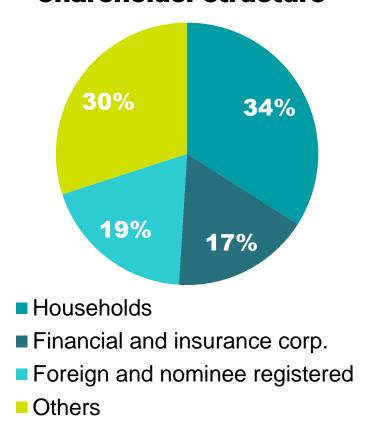
